





We remind you that the residents of the village of Umm al-Khair arrived in their current location after being expelled from their village in the Negev during the Nakba, and bought the land on which their village is located from the landowners who were residents of Yatta. The Jordanian occupation that ruled at the time recognized the purchase, but one day the Israeli occupation arrived in the West Bank and declared ownership of the village's lands.








In the 1980s, the residents of the village were expelled from most of its area, which became a military base and three years later the Carmel settlement. The residents of Umm al-Khair remained in the small part of the village that remained to them, and since then they have lived there under daily abuse and expulsion attempts by settlers, the army, police and the Israeli courts.



1/7 Last Monday, another hearing was held in the High Court of Justice following a contempt of court petition filed by residents of the village of Zanuta through the Hakel organization. This after the High Court accepted their petition last summer, which was filed following the expulsion of the village residents due to threats and settler violence. ynet.co.il/news/article/h...

2/7 Last summer, the High Court of Justice ruled that the police must secure the return of the village residents to the place from which they were expelled, and provide them with protection. However, as one might guess, the police did not implement the court's decision, and since then the residents of Zanuta have been expelled a second time.

3/7 In a hearing on Monday, the judges criticized the police for not preventing the violent incidents, after more than 100 more such incidents were reported since the petition was received. The police responded with ridiculous excuses for why they were not
