


Thousands of olive trees were uprooted in al-Mughayyir following a military order issued by Apartheid General, Bluth: 300 dunams were cited, but 620 were destroyed. Meanwhile, settlers carve new roads for more land grabs — all under army protection. Thread. >>




1/ A few days ago, we published a post describing the "shaping operations" of Apartheid General Bluth, east of the village of al-Mughayyir, during which thousands of olive trees

belonging to the village's residents were savagely uprooted. >>

2/ These "shaping operations" followed Bluth's signing of a military order titled "Order Regarding the Taking of Security Measures No. 25/25." The order stated that the area covered was just under 300 dunams, marked in red on the attached map. >>

- 3/ In practice, the work was carried out jointly by the army and local settlers who own heavy machinery. The uprooting operations lasted for several days. >>
- 4/ Following mapping we conducted on the ground, we can now say that the actual area where the army and settlers uprooted trees stands at about 620 dunams more than double the area included in the order. >>



- 5/ In addition, settlers have begun and continue to carve an entirely new road, with the aim of seizing thousands of dunams between al-Mughayyir and the extremely violent outposts east of the Shiloh settlement. >>
- 6/ We assume that along this illegal road, settlers will soon establish yet another outpost, whose purpose will be to further tighten the noose around the village of al-Mughayyir. >>
- 7/ Work at the site has been ongoing for over a week and a half, leaving no doubt that Apartheid General Bluth and his subordinate, Col. 'Anan Fares recently appointed commander of the Binyamin Brigade, under whose responsibility this area falls >>
- 8/ both were, and remain, fully aware of what is happening on the ground: settlers, under army protection, are uprooting olive trees on hundreds of dunams not covered by the military order.





9/ Both officers bear personal responsibility for this crime. One can only hope that the day will come when they will be brought to justice.
